Tigers Face Second Big Ten Opponent of Season at Stomp in the Swamp

The LSU Tigers (3-0-2) and Indiana Hoosiers (3-1-1) have never faced one another on the soccer pitch in their history, but the two sides will lock horns in Sunday's finale at the Stomp in the Swamp with kickoff set for 1 p.m. CT on the SEC Network+. The Tigers have fired out of the blocks with a five-match unbeaten run to start their season as a win or draw against Indiana on Sunday would give them their fourth-best start to a season in 21 seasons in the program's history. The Hoosiers are also fast out of the gate with three wins to their credit in their first five matches, including a 2-0 shutout of Middle Tennessee State in the opening match of the Stomp in the Swamp on Friday afternoon. Indiana also enjoyed a weekend sweep as champions of Purdue's Boilermaker Challenge Cup last weekend when they followed a 1-0 shutout of Missouri on Aug. 28 with a matching 1-0 win over Baylor on Aug. 30. The Hoosiers enter Sunday's match riding a threegame winning streak, largely led by a stifling defense that has kept three clean sheets while holding their opponents off of the scoreboard in their last 457 minutes of play. Indiana's leading scorer through its first five matches of the season is defender Marissa Borschke, who headed home the second goal of the match in the 39th minute in her team's 2-0 win over Middle Tennessee State in Friday's opener at the Stomp in the Swamp. The Hoosiers are dangerous on set pieces in 2015 as three of their five goals scored on the campaign have come from corner kicks. Indiana's only loss this season came in their season opener with a 2-1 home defeat to No. 13-ranked Virginia Tech. This marks the second week in a row in which the Tigers will play host to a Big Ten opponent after scoring a 1-0 win over the Minnesota Golden Gophers last Sunday to complete a weekend sweep at the "Battle on the Bayou." LSU looks to level its all-time record against Big Ten opponents at 3-3 after winning two and dropping three of their previous five matches. After playing away from home in each of their first four matches against Big Ten opposition, going 1-3 in those games, the Tigers will now host a Big Ten team on their home field for the second-straight weekend when they face Indiana on Sunday afternoon.

They will now host a team from the Big Ten on consecutive weekends with Indiana coming to town for the Stomp in the Swamp this Sunday at 1 p.m.

- Senior goalkeeper Catalina Rubiano kept her first career clean sheet in the Tigers' 1-0 win over the Minnesota Golden Gophers last Sunday.

- LSU's head coach Brian Lee will be going for career win No. 250 when the Tigers face the Hoosiers on Sunday afternoon as he heads into the match with 249 wins on his resume.
- Senior defender Alex Arlitt has been honored this week after leading LSU's defensive efforts in a sweep of Western Kentucky and Minnesota last weekend. She has been named to the TopDrawerSoccer.com Women's National Team of the Week and a CollegeSoccer360.com Primetime Performer of the Week for her efforts.
- The Tigers feature an experiened squad in 2015 with nine seniors leading the way, including five fifthyear seniors on the roster. Among LSU's fifth-year seniors are **Alex** Arlitt, Lexi Gibbs, Natalia Gomezlunco. Emma Meckfessel and Catalina Rubiano.

Tigers Seeking Fourth-Best Start to Season vs. Indiana

The Tigers ran their unbeaten record to 3-0-2 to start the 2015 season after playing Ball State to a 1-1 draw in Friday's nightcap to kick off the "Stomp in the Swamp." They will now look to remain unbeaten in their first six games to open the season for the fourth time in program history as a win or draw against the Hoosiers would be their fourth-best start to a season in the program's 21-year history. They were also unbeaten in six matches with a 5-0-1 mark in 2004. The Tigers are no stranger to fast starts under Brian Lee as they set a school record with seven-straight wins to start a campaign in 2008, just one year after they opened up the 2007 season with a program-record mark of eight matches unbeaten with a 6-0-2 run en route to earning their first ever trip to the NCAA Division I Women's Soccer Tournament that season.

LSU Looks to Even All-Time Series vs. Big Ten Conference

The Tigers had never faced a Big Ten Conference opponent on their home field before last Sunday's 1-0 win over Minnesota to wrap up a weekend sweep with two wins at the "Battle on the Bayou." While it marked their fifth match all-time against Big Ten opposition, the Tigers had faced each of their first four opponents away from home with a 1-3 record in those four games. Their win over Minnesota last Sunday came seven years to the day when they scored their first victory against a Big Ten program with a 2-0 blanking of the Northwestern Wildcats in a match played on Aug. 30, 2008, on the shores of Lake Michigan in Evanston, Illinois. LSU will level its all-time record against Big Ten opponents to 3-3 with a win against Indiana on Sunday afternoon to wrap up this year's "Stomp in the Swamp."

Defense Holds Gophers Without a Shot On Goal in 1-0 Shutout

For the first time in nearly five years, the Tigers held their opponent without a shot on goal in a match when Minnesota failed to find the target on just four shot attempts in last Sunday's finale at the "Battle on the Bayou." The Golden Gophers managed just one shot attempt in the second half as LSU's sophomore **Jorian Baucom** scored the winner with a header from **Summer Clarke's** end-line cross in the 70th minute in a 1-0 win. It marked the first time since Oct. 8, 2010, that the Tigers held their opponent without a shot on goal when they kept SEC rival Kentucky off target in 104 minutes in a 1-0 double overtime victory at the LSU Soccer Stadium in Baton Rouge. In fact, LSU has now held an opponent without a shot on goal in a match a total of 17 times in their history, including four times against major NCAA Division I level opposition. Along with Minnesota on Sunday and Kentucky during the 2010 season, the Tigers also held the likes of Vanderbilt (Oct. 17, 2008) and Mississippi State (Sept. 28, 2009) without a shot on goal in 90 minutes of a match.

Arlitt Honored for Defensive Performance at "Battle on the Bayou"

LSU's senior defender **Alex Arlitt** was recognized Tuesday for her efforts in leading the Tigers to a weekend sweep with wins over Western Kentucky and Minnesota last weekend with a selection to the TopDrawerSoccer.com Women's National Team of the Week and nomination as a CollegeSoccer360.com Primetime Performer of the Week. The "Battle on the Bayou" Defensive MVP anchored a defensive back line for the Tigers that also featured junior **Megan Lee**, sophomore **Jordane Carvery** and freshman **Alex Thomas** that held Minnesota without a shot on goal in 90 minutes. Arlitt was part of an LSU back line that kept Western Kentucky and Minnesota to a combined total of three second-half shots in their games this weekend, with the Tigers outshooting their opponents by 21-3 margin in the second halves of both games at the Battle on the Bayou. By picking up national awards this week, Arlitt became LSU's 14th selection all-time to the TopDrawerSoccer.com Women's National Team of the Week for her performance, and the sixth Tiger in recent seasons to be honored as a CollegeSoccer360.com Primetime Performer of the Week.

Baucom Picks Up Where She Left Off as Team's Top Scorer

Striker **Jorian Baucom** has picked up right where she left off as LSU's leading goal scorer at the end of her freshman season in 2014 as she again tops the team's scoring charts in 2015 with four goals to her credit through five matches to open her sophomore campaign. That includes a pair of game-winning goals in the early going as she found the back of the net in the 31st minute of LSU's 2-1 season-opening win at Oregon on Aug. 21 and 70th minute of the Tigers' 1-0 win over Minnesota last Sunday afternoon. In addition. Baucom has also twice scored a goal and served up an assist in a match this season as she set up **Summer Clarke's** opener in the 24th minute at Oregon before assisting **Debbie Hahn's** game-winner in the 58th minute and finding the scoresheet herself in the 63rd minute of LSU's 4-1 win against Western Kentucky in their "Battle on the Bayou" opener back on Aug. 28. Baucom was prolific in her first season of college soccer as she netted eight goals and dished out three assists for 19 points as LSU's top scorer a year ago.

LSU Tigers Feature Diverse Attack in 2015 Season

The Tigers have often featured a diverse attack going forward in their 10 previous seasons under head coach Brian Lee, and that appears to be the case once again in 2015 as six different Tigers have already found the scoresheet in the team's first five matches of the season. LSU has already bagged nine goals heading into Sunday's clash with Big Ten foe Indiana, including a team-leading four goals scored by sophomore striker **Jorian Baucom** to date. Also adding their names to the team's scoring charts in 2015 are senior **Fernanda Pina**, junior **Summer Clarke**, sophomore **Debbie Hahn** and freshmen **Gabriela Maldonado** and **Alex Thomas**. With Thomas scoring in LSU's 1-1 draw with Northwestern State and Maldonado and Hahn both finding the net in the team's 4-1 win over Western Kentucky, each has now scored for the Tigers in their debut seasons with the program. Clarke is LSU's active career scoring leader as the former Second-Team All-SEC striker has netted 18 goals as a Tiger, while Baucom has scored 12 goals and Pina has added 11 goals in their collegiate careers.

Baucom Rejoins Tigers after Training with U.S. U-20s in Spring

Jorian Baucom capitalized on the promise she showed during her freshman season with the Tigers last fall with an invitation to train with the Under-20 U.S. Women's National Team on three separate occasions during the 2015 spring season as she looks to earn her place in the team for the 2016 FIFA U-20 Women's World Cup to be held in Papua New Guinea. Baucom trained at U.S. Soccer's National Training Center in Carson, California, in April and May before turning up at the U.S. Olympic Training Center in nearby Chula Vista in July. When not training with the U.S. U-20s, she led the Tigers in scoring during the 2015 spring season with three goals in her four appearances with the team as the Tigers posted a 3-1-1 record in exhibition play, including a 1-1 away draw with Auburn and a 2-0 shutout of Ole Miss on a neutral field.

Tigers Boast Experienced Squad With Nine Seniors in 2015

LSU's roster in 2015 features a blend of experience with nine seniors in the squad combined with a talented group of underclassmen that head coach Brian Lee hopes will be a recipe for success this fall. Among LSU's nine seniors this season are five fifth-year seniors as defender **Alex Arlitt**, forward **Lexi Gibbs**, midfielder **Natalia Gomez-Junco**, defender **Emma Meckfessel** and goalkeeper **Catalina Rubiano** are among the most senior of players in the SEC competing in the 2015 season. In fact, Arlitt, Gomez-Junco and Rubiano join fourth-year senior **Heather Magee** in leading the way on the field as first-team starters in LSU's lineup this season. Gibbs and fellow senior **Gracie Campbell** have also featured in the starting 11 in the opening stages of the campaign, while coming off the bench in recent matches against Western Kentucky, Minnesota and Ball State. **Fernanda Pina** is another talented senior who has made an impact while coming off the bench.

Tigers Tabbed for 11th Place in SEC Preseason Ballot of Head Coaches

The Tigers were tabbed by the league's head coaches to finish in 11th place among the 14 clubs in the SEC's preseason ballot announced prior to the start of the 2015 season. The Florida Gators were tabbed as the preseason favorites to claim the SEC Championship in 2015 with 11 of the 14 first-place votes on offer and 167 points in the preseason ballot. Two-time defending SEC Champion Texas A&M followed in second place with two first-place votes and 149 as the Aggies look to win a third-straight SEC title this fall. Also receiving one first-place vote in the ballot was Kentucky, which trailed in third place with 140 points. South Carolina (134) in fourth and Tennessee (117) in fifth rounded out the Top 5 teams in the poll.
