# LSU COACH PAUL MAINIERI

· LSU coach Paul Mainieri is in his 34th season as a college coach with six seasons at St. Thomas University (1993-88), six seasons at Air Force (1989-94), 12 seasons at Notre Dame (1995-2006) and 10 seasons at LSU (2007-present) ... his overall record is 1,279-653-8 and he is 415-161-3 in his 10th season at LSU ... he was inducted in January 2014 into the American Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame ... Mainieri is one of only eight NCAA Division I active coaches with at least 1,200 career victories ... he earned National Coach of the Year recognition in 2008, 2009 and 2015 ... Mainieri directed LSU to the 2009 College World Series title, and he also led the Tigers to CWS appearances in 2008, 2013 and 2015 ... under Mainieri, the Tigers have won five SEC Tournament titles (2008, 2009, 2010, 2013, 2014), five SEC Western Division titles (2008, 2009, 2012, 2013, 2015) and the 2009, 2012 and 2015 SEC regular-season championships.

# **NOTES ON THE TIGERS**

- LSU has won 14 straight season-opening games, and the Tigers are 9-0 under Paul Mainieri in season openers. The Tigers' last loss in an opening game came in 2001, when Kansas State defeated LSU, 9-8, in the original Alex Box Stadium.
- · LSU, which has the most wins in the nation over the past four seasons (204 wins) and the past eight seasons (387 wins), captured the 2015 SEC championship and advanced to the College World Series for the second time in three years. LSU posted a nation's-best 54 victories and was ranked No.1 for 10 consecutive weeks during the 2015 campaign.
- The 2016 LSU roster includes 17 lettermen from the 2015 club, including five position players with starting experience and 11 pitchers that recorded innings last season. The LSU veterans are complemented by a talented class of 16 newcomers, including 10 position players, five pitchers and one two-way player.
- Junior left-hander Jared Poche' (9-2, 3.05 ERA in 2015), will start Friday night's game against Cincinnati. Poche', a 2016 preseason All-American, worked 109.1 innings last season, recording 25 walks and 72 strikeouts. Poche' has enjoyed outstanding back-to-back seasons at LSU, entering his junior year with an 18-5 career record as a weekend starter (34 career starts).
- Sophomore right-hander Alex Lange (12-0, 1.97 ERA in 2015), last season's National Freshman Pitcher of the Year, will start on the mound for LSU on Saturday,






